Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance: Supervisor Bergman called the meeting to order at
7:00 PM, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Additions or Corrections to Agenda: Noting the date of the meeting on the Agenda should be
March 12, and adding Item 7 Water Works Quotes, (a) Library Lawn Maintenance, (b) Library
Sprinkler Service Agreement, and (c) Historical Commission Sprinkler Service Agreement,
motion by Goodfellow, second by B. Johnson, to approve the Agenda with this correction
and the additions. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Comment for Agenda Items:

Susannah Watts introduced herself and shared her position on issues. She is running for
State Representative for Michigan House District 90.

Brooks Burg of 10870 Phelps wanted to affirm the moratorium on data centers; that's what
he knows everyone in Sparta Township wants.

Approval of Minutes and Treasurer's Report

1. Approval of Minutes—February 12, 2026, and Special Workshop Meeting
February 26, 2026: Motion by Goodfellow, second by A. Johnson, to approve the
Minutes of February 12, 2026. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Goodfellow,
second by B. Johnson, to approve the Special Workshop Meeting Minutes of February 26,
2026. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Treasurer's Report: Motion by Goodfellow, second by Steffens, to approve the Report.
Motion carried unanimously.
3. Building Department Monthly Report: No report received; no action taken.

Public Hearing: 2026–2027 Sparta Township Budget

Public Hearing opened at 7:08 PM

Mike Lamb, realtor for Sparta resident Nancy Berger, conveyed Nancy's offer to sell a ¼ acre
of property to the Township for the purpose of expanding the cemetery at the assessed
value of approximately \$44,000. Closing costs could be an additional \$4,000. Nancy's home
would be sold separately. The size of the property would allow for 800 additional burial sites.

Public Hearing closed at 7:15 PM

Business Items

1. Approval of Bills: Motion by Steffens, second by Goodfellow, to approve the bills. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Approval of 2026–27 Sparta Township Budget: Motion by Savage, second by Goodfellow, to reduce Budget Item Dept. 264 Capital Outlay by \$50,000 (to \$45,000) and to pursue a letter of intent for the property from Mrs. Berger. Motion carried six to one, with Bergman opposing. Savage will write the letter of intent and visit Mrs. Berger. Motion by Savage, second by B. Johnson, to leave the roads at zero. Motion carried five to two, with Bergman and Goodfellow opposing. Motion by Savage, second by B. Johnson, to raise the Library budget up to the \$10,000 that they asked for, for a total of \$215,000. Motion carried six to one, with Goodfellow opposing. A. Johnson mentioned she lowered the deputy treasurer line item to \$25,000. Motion by Steffens, second by A. Johnson, to approve the budget. Motion carried six to one, with Bergman opposing.
3. Accessory Dwelling Unit Regulations: The document was not in the board packet. Motion by A. Johnson, second by Bradford, to table. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Data Center Moratorium Resolution: Goodfellow requested and the Board agreed to remove Exhibit A and its references; Exhibit B then becomes Exhibit A. Motion by Goodfellow, second by B. Johnson, to approve the Resolution. Roll call vote: Savage, yes; Bradford, yes; Goodfellow, yes; A. Johnson, yes; B. Johnson, yes; Steffens, yes; Bergman, yes. Motion carried unanimously.
5. Historical Commission Appointment—Barb Johnson: Motion by Goodfellow, second by Bradford, to accept the appointment of Barb Johnson to the Sparta Township Historical Commission. Motion carried unanimously.
6. Historical General Museum Rental: Sparta Township Historical Commission Chairman Pinckney, present with Roxie Claxton, explained the rental arrangement of the military museum (\$100 per month) and the new museum (\$300 per month plus utilities), both at the Civic Center.
7. Water Works Quotes
 - (a) Library Lawn Maintenance: Motion by Bradford, second by B. Johnson, to accept the bid from Water Works to be paid by April 1, 2026. Motion carried unanimously.
 - (b) Library Sprinkler Service Agreement: Motion by Steffens, second by Savage, to approve the library service agreement. Motion carried unanimously.
 - (c) Historical Commission Sprinkler Service Agreement: Motion by Steffens, second by Savage, to approve the Historical Commission sprinkler agreement. Motion carried unanimously.

Other Informational: Savage checked out textmygov. It may be beneficial, maybe more so for the Village than the Township. The cost is \$7,000 per year, and the Township doesn't have access to too many phone numbers. Goodfellow is reviewing and working on a Principles of Township Governance and Excellence; Bergman suggested that the deputies sign the document if they want to. Steffens shared a discussion he had with Mike Wahlfeld, who sits on the State Board. Water is becoming a huge issue. In Ottawa County, 100 subdivisions sit on hold due to lack of water. Some solutions include recharging the aquifer faster and restricting high-output wells in Kent County.

Public Comment:

Robert Whalen, Village President of 273 River Road, corrected the Supervisor's claim that taxes will increase if we become a city; Whalen stated the millage won't go up. The current mills is 12 and has been so for 15 years. If the Village residents vote to become a city, he guarantees, this council and our manager guarantee 1.2 mills lowered for the city residents. Brian Sapita of 5300 Patterson, Grand Rapids, is senior manager for government affairs for Comcast. He wanted to introduce himself. The franchise with the Township is coming up in the next year, and he wanted to put a face to the email that will be coming in. He hopes the Board is having a great day.

Sparta Library Director Tuinstra thanked the Board for their support. The community is really enjoying the library, and with the Board's help, we can continue to do that.

Jody Hyde of 2155 VanDyke St., Conklin, discussed an item from the January 8 meeting and that an ordinance or code of conduct was mentioned. Other township meetings are recorded, watched, appreciated, and get the community more involved. She stated that they want to control what she says and does outside of the office time in the Township. Their presentation proved she did not break the law. She questioned what the code of conduct will include: selective, personal, a tool to silence, what level of control? She discussed the Supervisor's residency.

Robert Carlstrom of 475 Martindale had accessory dwelling unit points to consider and an insurance question on the museum rental.

Chad Momber is a supporter of purchasing the cemetery land due to it being the only area that can be acquired to expand the cemetery. He has some ideas to help the Township that he will run by the realtor selling the property.

Sparta Township Historical Commission Chairman Pinckney confirmed that the Township has insurance on the military museum, and Supervisor Bergman will work on insurance for the new museum.

Adjournment: Motion by B. Johnson, second by Savage, to adjourn the meeting at 8:13 PM.

Motion carried unanimously. The next regular meeting of the Sparta Township Board will be Thursday, April 9, at 7 PM.

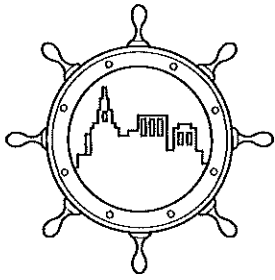

Re: Accessory Dwelling Units

The Planning Commission held a public hearing for the proposed amendment at their January 13, 2026, meeting. Per public comment received and further deliberations by the Commission it was determined that Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) should only be allowed as special land uses and that only family members should be permitted to reside in ADUs.

We made the directed updates to the proposed ADU amendment. These updates were reviewed at the Planning Commission's February 10, 2026, meeting and the Commission has recommended adoption of the proposed amendment.

If adopted, ADUs will be permitted as a special land use in all districts where single-family homes are permitted. An ADU will have to meet all standards identified in the amendment. Additionally, the section listing the ADU requirements will be inserted next to the section containing requirements for all accessory buildings and other sections will be renumbered. This insertion is so that regulations are more easily found and clearly organized.

Pending the Board's review of the proposed amendment you will need to determine whether to adopt the proposed amendment.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING
ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS**

THE TOWNSHIP OF SPARTA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment of Section 154.006 of the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance.

Section 154.006 of the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance is amended by the addition of the following definition, which shall be inserted in alphabetical order:

ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT (ADU). A detached residential living unit on the same parcel on which a single-family dwelling is located that provides independent living facilities, including basic requirements for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation, for one (1) or more person(s).

Section 2. Renumbering Sections 154.253 through 154.270 of the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance.

The numbers of Section 154.253 through 154.270 of the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance shall be increased by 0.001, such that the new numbering will correspond with the chart below:

Section 3. Revision of Internal References.

Any internal references within the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance to the sections renumbered in Section 2 above shall be revised to reflect the new section numbers as indicated in the chart. This includes, but is not limited to, cross-references found in other sections of the Zoning Ordinance, tables of contents, indexes, appendices, and any other citations or references that rely on the previous numbering.

Section 4. Addition of a New Section 154.253 to the Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance.

The Sparta Township Zoning Ordinance is amended by the addition of a new Section 154.253, which reads in its entirety as follows:

§ 154.253 ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS

Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) are intended to provide flexible, long-term living quarters for extended family or non-family members. ADUs are subject to the following regulations.

- (A) An ADU shall be detached from the principal dwelling.
- (B) ADUs shall be permitted as a Special Use in all districts where single-family dwellings are permitted by right or by special land use.
- (C) ADUs shall only be permitted as an accessory use to a single-family dwelling.
- (D) The property owner shall maintain residence on the property, either in the principal dwelling or the ADU.
- (E) Persons occupying the dwelling not occupied by the property owner shall be a Family member of the property owner.
- (F) ADUs shall have their own separate entrances, kitchens, sleeping areas, and full bathroom facilities.
- (G) ADUs shall only be located in the rear yard.
- (H) The dwelling area of an ADU shall meet all setback requirements applicable to the principal dwelling. For the purposes of this Section, “dwelling area” means the portion of a structure used for habitation, including sleeping, cooking, and sanitation facilities.
- (I) ADUs shall meet all applicable building, safety, and fire codes.

- (J) ADUs shall be connected to a sewage disposal system and water supply system approved by the County Health Department. Proof of Health Department approval must be provided prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- (K) Exterior building materials and designs shall be of similar style and character as that of the principal dwelling.
- (L) An ADU shall have a minimum Floor Area of 300 square feet.
- (M) An ADU shall have a maximum Floor Area of 850 square feet.
- (N) ADU side wall height, as measured from the existing grade to the bearing point of the roof truss, shall not exceed sixteen (16) feet.
- (O) No more than two persons shall reside in an ADU.
- (P) ADUs shall count toward the maximum number and square footage for Accessory Buildings.
- (Q) ADUs may be erected as an integral part of a permitted Accessory Building.
- (R) Mobile Homes, recreational vehicles, and temporary structures shall not be used as an ADU.
- (S) An ADU shall not be utilized as a Motel, Hotel, Motor Hotel, Boarding House, Lodging House, Rooming House, or Bed and Breakfast.

Section 5. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid for any reason, that declaration does not affect the validity of all other sections of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Repealer.

This Ordinance expressly repeals all other Township ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance.

Section 7. Effective Date.

This Ordinance takes effect seven (7) days after publication of this Ordinance or of a summary of it as permitted by law.

The following resolution was offered for adoption by Board member _____ and was seconded by Board member _____.

WHEREAS, the Sparta Township Library (“Library”) was formed under Section 10 of Act 164 of 1877, as amended (MCL 397.210); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10c of Act 164 of 1877, as amended (MCL 397.210c), the Sparta Township Library Board (“Library Board”) has determined that the renewal of the dedicated library millage of 0.2375 mills for ten (10) years is necessary to provide for adequate library services and has approved a Sparta Township Library millage proposal for the August 2, 2016 election (a copy of the Library Board’s resolution is attached as Exhibit A); and

WHEREAS, the Township Board wishes to submit the Library millage proposal to the qualified electors of the Township at a Township special election to be held on the regular election date of August 4, 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Board calls a special Township election to be held on the regular election date of August 4, 2026 (the primary election).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to MCL 397.210c and the Michigan Election Law, the Township Board hereby approves and certifies the following proposal for submission to the qualified electors of the Township at the August 4, 2026 election:

**SPARTA TOWNSHIP LIBRARY
MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL**

Shall the previously authorized increase in the tax rate limitation on all taxable property in Sparta Township, Kent County, that expired in 2025 be renewed and the Township be authorized to levy a millage annually in an amount to exceed .2375 mill (\$0.2375 per each \$1,000 of taxable value) against all taxable property in the Township for a period of ten (10) years, 2026 through 2035, inclusive, to provide funds for operating, maintaining, and equipping the Sparta Township Library and for all

other library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the Township will collect if the millage is approved and levied in the first year of levy (2026) is approximately \$106,000. The revenue from this millage levy will be disbursed to the Sparta Township Library.

The following is for informational purposes:

If approved and levied, this millage will raise an estimated \$106,000 in the first year of the levy (2026). The revenues from this millage will be disbursed to the Sparta Township Library as required by law. To the extent required by law, a portion of the revenues from this millage (approximately 4.4% in the first year of the levy) will be captured within the district of and disbursed to the Village of Sparta Downtown Development Authority.

The following Resolution was offered by Jane Ohanesian
and seconded by Joy Leussenkamp.

WHEREAS, the Sparta Township Library ("Library") is a township library organized under 1877 PA 164 ("PA 164") serving the residents of Sparta Township ("Township"); and

WHEREAS, as required by Section 10c of PA 164, the Library Board may determine by resolution that, if a previously authorized millage was approved for a specific number of years, the millage should be renewed and/or increased; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, voters in the Township approved a millage in the amount of .25 mill for a period of ten (10) years and that millage expired in 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Library Board desires to ask voters to renew the millage, which was last levied at a millage rate of .2375 mill, for ten (10) years beginning with the 2026 levy; and

WHEREAS, the Library Board has determined that placing the millage request on the

ballot at the August 4, 2026 election is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the Township residents.

THEREFORE, the Library Board of the Sparta Township Library, Kent County, Michigan, resolves as follows:

1. The Library Board of the Sparta Township Library has determined that a millage of .2375 mill is necessary for the Library.
2. To that end, the Library Board approves the ballot language attached as Exhibit A and certifies that the proposition attached as Exhibit A shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the Township at an election to be held on Tuesday, August 4, 2026.
3. The Library Board Secretary and/or Director is authorized and directed to promptly submit this Resolution and the ballot language attached as Exhibit A to the Sparta Township Clerk (who shall forward the Resolution and ballot language to the Kent County Clerk) so that the attached millage proposal may be presented to voters at the August 4, 2026 election.
4. Any resolution inconsistent with this Resolution is hereby rescinded.

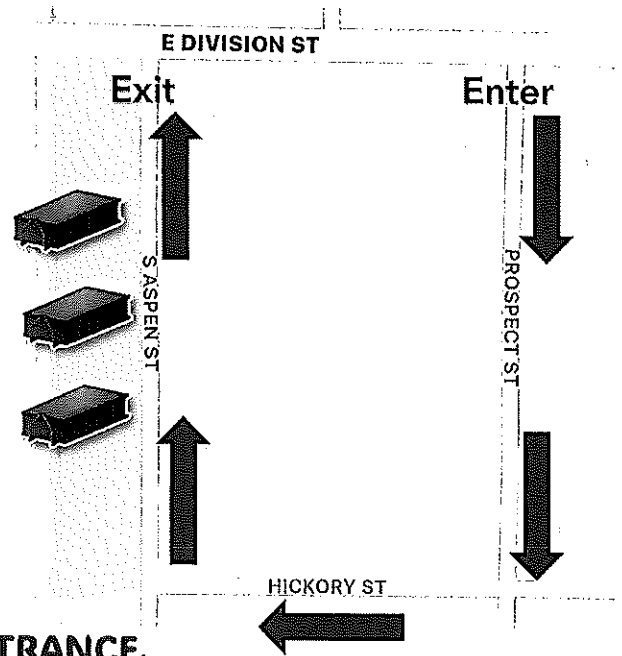
